Considerable attention in the medical and lay press has been focused on the prescribing of opioids both in hospital and community practice. Current practice is associated with unwanted personal and public health outcomes which are associated with a considerable economic cost. The problem often starts in hospital. Oral conventional opioids have become very popular as the mainstay of postoperative analgesia. On discharge from hospital, patients are frequently dispensed more tablets than they require. Five to ten percent of patients continue taking the opioids, even when inflammation associated with the surgery has resolved. These patients risk opioid dependence. There are two major elements which underlie this outcome: lack of a documented opioid tapering strategy and lack of communication of the tapering strategy with the GP.

The Opioid Stewardship workshop will focus on the challenges anaesthetists face in private practice. The workshop will include three modules:

- What is the challenge regarding pain management and discharge planning in private practice and private hospitals?
- What are we doing currently in this space and what could be considered best practice?
- How do we move towards best practice?

The aim of this workshop is to identify how best practice can be achieved in the private sector.

To be in a relationship to what you’re experiencing, to abide it, and, learn to befriend it, that is where the healing or transformative result of the practice of mindfulness lies. It’s possible to befriend one’s fear rather than feeling stuck until the obstacle is shutdown. It’s healing to realise if only for a moment here and there, that you can be in a wiser relationship with your interior experience than just being driven by liking or hating it. By learning skills to maintain inner resilience, one can maintain an open, compassionate, receptive place for patients while also taking care of themselves.”

CASE CONFERENCES
